Welcome to the world of AI. Artificial Intelligence, we are told, is the path to the future. It can answer your phone, give you advice and fix your problems. Companies are letting us all become AI beta testers and we are discovering the failures of AI as the companies who use it are ignoring us.

I get it, we live in a global economy that is increasingly competitive. Everything produced today must be more, faster, cheaper and better tomorrow. The problem is that there are too many variables to program when encountering problems. AI may say it understands but it can't when it comes to multiple problems. There are just too many to program. And even when you set AI to learn, it coldly responds

This week I had a huge problem that a company tried to solve with AI. Microsoft in their immense wisdom stopped allowing me to use the programs that I pay a subscription for by terminating automatic logins. It has been so long since I have used the login that I can't remember what the password is. They also added an app that I must put on my phone called "Authenticator" to verify my password. I don't have that app. When I put in the password, I still couldn't get verified. When I asked for help, I was asked to login. Even their phone is answered by AI who says that the problem I am experiencing must be done online. I merely have to login.

canceling my Microsoft account. So, I am writing this article using an alternative word processor and feeling pretty good about it.

Recently someone showed me a text that was received from a church she was considered visiting. It said it was from the pastor. It said her name in the text but it was obviously AI generated. Yes, it is efficient but it has no more concern about the person than a generic flyer. I can assure you that when someone asks for me to text them, I am the one who texts them. Computers will never be concerned. Computers will never be spiritual no matter how many science fiction films say that they will.

Churches are also businesses. They want it to attract people. They are looking at ways to do so without needing people to do it. Some think it will multiply their efforts. I wonder how long it will be before AI will be writing the sermons. Honestly, the sermons may be better than mine but they will never be spiritual.

I suppose that many people will flock to the churches whose AI has attracted them with fast, clever texts that appear to come from someone. They will gather in crowds to sing music generated by AI. They may hear sermons written and directed by AI. It will all be fine until they need a human who will care about them. Maybe by then, the church will be as big as Microsoft that doesn't really need their business.

If people are to be reached to trust in Christ rather than attend an event, it will take people reaching them. That will never change. Our mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ. AI can't do that. You are absolutely needed to accomplish the mission. The church can never replace you with technology. We might just be the last business left that knows that.

The XP Corner: Cultural Christianity A Satanic Strategy

Perhaps Jonathan Leeman says it best in his book, "Church Membership", when he speaks about one of Satan's favorite strategies for undercutting the Kingdom of Christ:

"Local churches, remember, are embassies. They don't dwell in neutral or friendly territory but behind enemy lines. That's why Paul, in 1 Corinthians 5 equates excommunicating a man caught in adultery with handing him over to Satan. Satan is the prince of this world, and the kingdoms of the world temporarily belong to him (John 12:31; 14:30; Matt 4:8-9)."

Satan uses different devices in different locations to undermine Christ's Kingdom. A favorite devise of his in the West is cultural Christianity. The American brand of cultural Christianity results from well-intentioned adults handing out candy of cheap grace to five-year-old and twenty-five-year-olds alike. You ask them if they want to be with mommy and daddy in heaven or pressure them into walking an aisle. The point is, you play on their fears, emotions or appetites in order to get quick, unconsidered professions of faith. Then you immediately affirm those professions of faith."

"The genius of this devise is that it always allows Satan to inoculate their hosts against real Christianity. It's nearly impossible to share the gospel with a cultural Christian because he already gives lip service to it. "Yes, I believe that". But there is no repentance. He merely baptizes a slightly sanitized version of his old self into Christianity".

The most obvious sign that Satan's strategy is effective is that cultural Christians do not produce fruit. How could they, apart from the vine? They are the walking dead – spiritually worthless and destined to be thrown into the fire (John 15:4-6). Churches are full of them.


